Requirements: University of Idaho student pursuing a degree within the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences Department (or related field)

Motivation to learn first-hand about Idaho's legislative process

Interest in agriculture policy issues, particularly how they relate to Idaho's wheat and barley growers

Description: Approximately 50 percent of this internship will be spent working with the Idaho Legislature during the 2018 Legislative Session. The other 50 percent will be spent at the IGPA office, directly across the street from the capitol building.

Legislative duties will involve attending legislative committee meetings and hearings, tracking bills, taking notes, and scheduling and attending meetings and events, as directed.

IGPA office duties will include contributing to a weekly update and other member communications; assisting with membership directory organization, proofing, and distribution; increasing IGPA's social media presence; and undertaking various research and writing projects, as directed.

Before the start of the legislative session, the intern would travel to Spokane, WA, to help staff the Tri-State Grain Growers Convention, November 8-11. Convention duties include set-up and execution of meetings and events, gathering and organizing auction items, taking meeting minutes, and other duties as assigned.

Time Frame: November 8-11, 2017 in Spokane, WA for Tri-State Grain Growers Convention; January-March 2018 in Boise Idaho for 2018 Legislative Session

Pay: \$1000/month for three months, and travel/hotel to attend Tri-State Convention in Spokane, WA. Internship will be roughly 40 hours a week during regular business hours.

Housing: Student must secure housing in Boise, ID from January – March, 2018.
